

RESOLUTION No. 3427

A RESOLUTION OF INTENT OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF RED LODGE, MONTANA TO REPLACE ALL OF THE LIGHTS AND FIXTURES IN CITY HALL, THE POLICE STATION, AND THE PUBLIC WORKS SHOP WITH LED LIGHTING

Whereas, the City of Red Lodge has had an Energy Corps Member, Katelynn Essig, serving as the City Sustainability Coordinator for the past year and a half; and

Whereas, Katelynn has worked diligently to develop a comprehensive LED lighting retrofit analysis for City Hall, the Police Station, and the Public Works shop; and

Whereas, replacing the lights in all three buildings with LED lights would create an environment that is better lit and thus safer; and

Whereas, confirmation has been received that this project will qualify for a \$3,700 rebate from Northwestern Energy; and

Whereas, it is estimated that monthly costs to light the three buildings will decrease from \$411 to \$292; an average annual savings of \$1428; and

Whereas, the project will have an approximate six year pay back period, after which the city will continue to benefit from annual savings in energy costs; and

Whereas, the funds for the project will come from the Capital Projects Budget, Fund#4030, Account #411000, Object #300, Cash Account #101900


NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council:

The City is authorized to spend up to \$13,000 during the 2016-17 fiscal year to replace all of the lights and fixtures in City Hall, the Police Station, and the Public Works shop with LED lighting.

INTRODUCED at a Regular meeting of the City Council on February 14, 2017 by Council Member Martha Brown.


