

## Parks and Recreation District: Pool

The 2015 Comprehensive Parks Plan identified and outlined many of the priorities for maintaining and improving Parks and Recreation in the City. One of the major issues identified in the Parks Plan is the state of the City Pool. Many parents and residents have expressed concern that if the pool can no longer function that many kids will not learn how to swim and will not learn how to swim and will not have an important summer activity.



The Red Lodge City Pool is a widely utilized asset of the community. The table below shows the number of people who purchased single day passes (General Admission and Lap Swim), swimming lessons, and multi-day passes during the 2016, 2017 and 2018 pool seasons.
